## PURPOSES FOR WHICH WILSON FUNDS MAY BE USED

Moneys available for disbursement by the FUND will be available for contingencies (Church financial emergencies caused by the failure of essential equipment or facilities inadequately covered by warranties or insurance --- such as a heating system boiler, air conditioning, roof collapse, etc.) These contingencies should always have first priority.

Other qualifying purposes for annual disbursements from this FUND would be in the form of CHALLENGES to the UUCA Board, or to a Committee, or to the Congregation. Any group applying for and receiving such funds must consist of not less than three voting members of the UUCA. The Fund will pay for up to ONE-HALF (50%) of the cost for each for the following:

- a) **New Program for Church** Initiating a NEW church program, class or procedure believed to be in the best interests of the Church (as approved by a meeting of the Congregation, or by the UUCA Board of Trustees).
- b) **New Church Furnishings/Equipment** New (or replacement) furnishings or pieces of equipment believed important and generally beneficial for the operation of the UU Church of Akron.
- c) Church Contributions to the Community Some specific charitable contribution by the UU Church of Akron to the Greater Akron community (such as Habitat for Humanity, help for battered women, help for the homeless, etc.)
- d) Activities intended to make the UUCA a friendlier and more interactive place- Various congregational get-togethers that help members and friends get to know each other better, and/or promote the education of our members on important church matters. (Fun is important too.) Examples are support in part of:
  - 1. Sunday Brunches and Coffees
  - 2. Pot Luck dinners or picnics for the UUCA congregation.
  - 3. Family movies, parties or lectures at the UUCA.
  - 4. Child-care during UUCA activities enumerated above.
- e.) Activities that support new and continuing ministries including targeted social justice ministries or priority circumstances that may arise from time to time.
