

Meet Your Stewardship Team

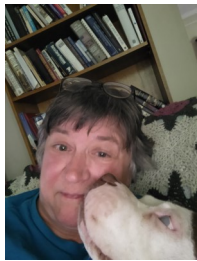
Our Mission is to create a culture of generosity that will enable UUCA to evolve with our members and our community. We approach this with passion and an eye to intersectionality.

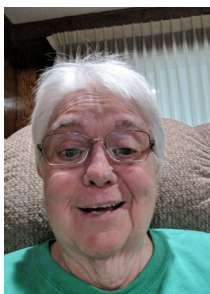
Deb Johnson

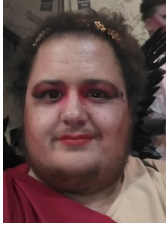

I welcome this opportunity to become more deeply involved in our congregation and will work to ensure its sustainability. Let's make it a fun journey as we build our future.



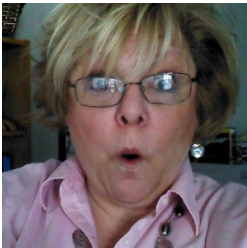
